

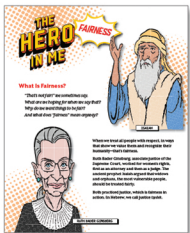

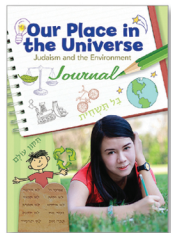
The Hero in Me

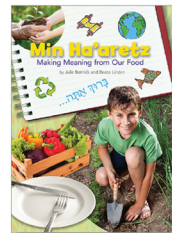
Let's Discover Mitzvot

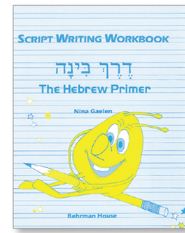


Min Ha'Aretz: Making Meaning from Our Food

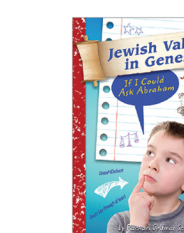
Make, Create, Celebrate: Jewish Holidays through Art

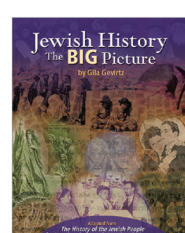

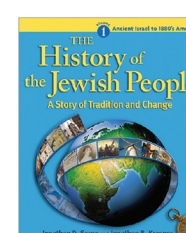

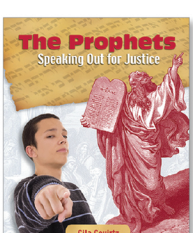
