

Invite your students to a Passover seder with Kayla and Kugel!

What's it about?

Kayla and her dog Kugel celebrate the Passover seder together: They say the four questions, eat the sweet *charoset* and the not-so-tasty *maror*, and retell the story of the Exodus. Of course, mischievous Kugel steals the *afikoman*, too! But not to worry—Kugel helps Kayla find it, and they conclude the seder with songs and celebration.

What can my students learn from the story?

Kayla and Kugel is a great way to introduce the following ideas to your students:

- The story of Passover
- Passover traditions, including the seder plate, the haggadah, and *afikoman*.
- The value of celebrating holidays with family

Discussion Questions

- What Passover traditions does your family have?
- At the beginning of the story, Kayla and Kugel ask the Four Questions. What questions do you have about Passover?
- If you could choose to add one food to the Passover seder plate, what would it be? Why?

Kid-Friendly Activities

- Bring in different style seder plates. Allow the students to examine them and discuss the different symbols they contain.
- Create a model seder for your students, complete with real or student-made seder plates, kiddush cups, matzah, and symbolic foods.
